MSN AND DOCTORAL EDUCATED NURSE SUPPLY

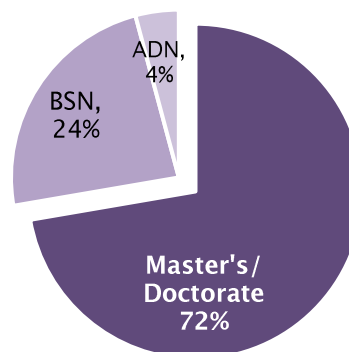


Characteristics are based on responses to FCN's survey of nurses during the 2016–2017 renewal cycle. Counts should be interpreted as estimates only.

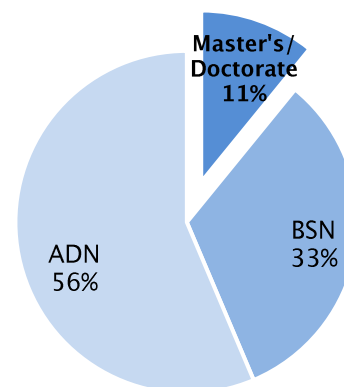
Florida nurses with a master's or doctorate:

- **11%** of clear and active RNs and **72%** of clear and active APRNs
- **5%** of **working RNs** hold a master's or doctorate *in nursing*
- **67%** of **working APRNs** hold a master's or doctorate *in nursing*, including 62% with an MSN and 5% with a doctorate.

NURSING FACULTY WITH ADVANCED DEGREES



Pre-licensure education programs had **2,150** full-time (89%) and **2,343** part-time faculty (75%) with a master's degree or higher in AY 2017–18.

52% of LPN, **79%** of ADN, and **95%** of BSN faculty held a master's degree or higher.

GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMS



In Fall 2018, **19 MSN** and **13 doctoral** programs were reported in Florida.

Thirteen (13) MSN programs offered Nurse Practitioner curricula, 12 had Nurse Educator curricula, 9 offered Leadership/Management curricula, and two (2) offered Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist degrees. One (1) Clinical Nurse Specialist program and one (1) Clinical Nurse Leader program were reported.

Seven (7) schools offered PhD programs, 11 offered DNP – Advanced Practice programs, six (6) offered Executive Leadership DNP programs, and three (3) had other nursing doctoral programs.

Responding programs reported a total of **3,895 students enrolled in MSN curricula** and **2,097 students enrolled in nursing doctoral programs** in September 2018. Additionally, 1,456 graduated from MSN programs and 468 graduated from doctoral programs in AY 2017–18.
