


According to FCN's <u>The State of the Nursing Workforce in Florida</u> report, registered nurses have a projected growth of 23,595 jobs (12.2%) from 2022-2030, with a total of 108,546 job openings over the eight-year period. That outlook is the same throughout the profession, in Florida and beyond. In-school presentations provide an excellent opportunity to inspire the next generation, providing students with a deeper understanding of the nursing profession and highlighting the vital role nurses play.

FCN is making free resources available to provide support for nurses who would like assistance with these presentations. Available supplies include presentation materials,
