The Florida Center for Nursing releases 2023 Impact Report

**Tampa, Fla.** - The Florida Center for Nursing (FCN) published its "2023 Impact Report." Consistent with Florida statute (§464.0195), the report details the Florida Center for Nursing's activities and impact during 2023 in pursuit of the goals of the center.

The report submitted to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House provides a comprehensive overview of FCN's nursing workforce research, community outreach, nursing workforce interventions, and dissemination of work during the past year. The report outlines the nursing workforce research and the key findings of the four technical reports that the Florida Center for Nursing published in 2023. The report also details the innovative nursing workforce interventions that the Florida Center for Nursing designed, developed, and piloted.

The Florida Center for Nursing is established to research and address issues of supply and demand for nursing, including issues of recruitment, retention, and utilization of nurse workforce resources. Nurses are critical to the health and wellness of Floridians. The future of nursing in Florida is dependent upon implementation of innovative strategies to ensure an adequate supply of qualified nurses to meet the needs of the people of Florida.
