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Report from FL Organization for Nursing Leadership Leslie Rogers PhD, MBA, RN

The FONL Research & Evidence-based Practice Committee supports the conduct of nursing research and dissemination of findings to FONL members and the nursing community. The following includes most recent activities, studies conducted and/or supported by the FONL Research Committee:

- Completed FONL Research & EBP Committee nursing research study: Nurse Perception of Ideal Leadership Behaviors Compared to Existing Nurse Leadership Behaviors.
 - Manuscript is in development for publication.
 - Key findings: Five ideal leadership behaviors and two self-reported leadership behaviors were significantly different for staff nurses and leaders, respectively, based on career stage.
 - While the top ten most ideal versus self-reported leadership behaviors were similar in both groups, the ranking was different.
 - Results from the study can be used to identify what behaviors staff nurses seek from their leaders, and leaders can use them to identify ways to implement these behaviors to meet staff nurses' needs.
 - Future research should also focus on understanding how these behaviors impact nurses' job performance and satisfaction.
- FONL Research & EBP Committee nursing research study Self-care practices of nurse leaders in Florida, completed data analysis in October 2025. Study PI Dr. Susan Fowler PhD RN CRRN NE-BC FCNS along with select FONL Research Committee members as study contributors. This is a replication study with an 18-item self-care survey. Plans for manuscript development for publication.

- Summary of the Research Objectives: Seeks to build on prior work examining nursing certification by exploring both leadership perceptions of factors that influence other nurses to become certified.
